Page 9.

3. HOW POINTS ARE AWARDED

Field Events

1st = 5; 2nd = 4; 3rd = 3; 4th = 2; 5th = 1

The points system will be as above, regardless of the amount of competitors in the class.

Page 11.

4(F) Junior Drivers

1. Juniors are eligible to compete from the age of 7 years, except in outdoor driving trials and drives when they must be 10 years of age or over on the day of the event.
6. Once a Junior reaches the age of 16 and is to be a Senior at the next driving Season, they will have the option to compete as a Novice or Senior Driver. If a Junior decides to upgrade to Novice their points will start at 100 and they will be upgraded to a Senior once 200 points are gained.

10(A) Indoor Driving Trials

5. Drivers may compete more than once per event with a different turnout (with the exception of a Junior driver that has a pony eligible for the Preliminary class), subject to time and numbers permitting. Horses/ponies may only compete twice per event.

10(D) Obstacles

1. Obstacles must be started as a Trot but cantering is allowed within the obstacle and through the finish. Competitors must return to a Trot immediately after clearing the finish.
